

Sheltering indoors during a nuclear disaster is the first step to staying safe



If a state of Alert is issued. firstly collect your children from school, return home and listen to the TV etc. for information while staying indoors.



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In a nuclear disaster, it is important to stay calm and await correct information and instructions from public authorities.

Staying in the home, "Sheltering indoors," is the first step to staying safe.*

- * Going outdoors can greatly increase your risk of exposure if radioactive material is somehow released from the nuclear power plant.
- * If everyone tries to evacuate far away all at once, this can lead to confusion and accidents, thus leading to increased risks.
